Up front in division 2 was also Minnesota's Taylor Witt, Washington's Darian Sanayei, and North Carolina's Keith Tucker. In the final, it was again FLY Racing's Chris Allredge who prevailed. After battling it out with Masterpool for sometime, Allredge settled down, and set the fast time on lap 3 with a 2:30.924. Another WPS rider, Braxton Prieto, had a good showing, winding up 8th overall. KTM had a solid hand on the open division, as they locked down the entire top 10 of the class. A lot of the top spots were open for some fresh faces though, as guys like Taylor Barnett, Donny Brown, Thomas Covington, Coleman Martin, and Conner Mitchell all fell outside the top 10.
